

IRA HOME ENERGY REBATES HOME ELECTRIFICATION AND APPLIANCES REBATE PROGRAM (HEAR)

Retail Purchase Program Guide

HEAR gives rebates to help low- and moderate-income families install efficient electric technologies. You can now upgrade qualifying ENERGY STAR® kitchen, laundry, or electric heat pump water heaters. Before making your purchase, be sure to follow all income, rebate eligibility guidelines, and photo requirements. **Your rebate application will be denied without a photo of your existing appliance, please make sure you have taken the required photos.**

Income Eligibility

Always check your income eligibility **BEFORE** shopping. All participating households must verify their total household annual income is less than 150% of the Area Median Income (AMI).

Income Eligibility	Maximum HEAR Project Rebate
Households below 80% AMI	100% of project costs up to \$14,000
Households between 80% and 150% AMI	50% of project costs up to \$14,000

Higher income households (>150% AMI) are NOT eligible for this program.

Eligible Products

Only ENERGY STAR certified products are eligible for rebates. You can purchase from any store or website that carries qualifying products. Always verify income eligibility first.

HEAR Upgrade	Rebate Max Per Product Category
ENERGY STAR electric heat pump water heater*	Up to \$1,750
ENERGY STAR electric heat pump clothes dryer	Up to \$840
ENERGY STAR electric stove, ENERGY STAR cooktop, ENERGY STAR range	Up to \$840

* ENERGY STAR electric heat pump water heaters are also available for an instant discount through participating [IRA Registered Contractors](#).

Product Notes

- Only new [ENERGY STAR products](#) qualify. No used or refurbished equipment.
- Delivery, installation/materials, and removal of old appliances are eligible project costs only if they are itemized on the **retailer receipt/invoice**. Sales tax and any additional costs, including contractor labor, fees, or services not listed on the retailer invoice, are not eligible for reimbursement.
- A new heat pump appliance cannot replace an existing heat pump appliance.
- Only eligible when upgrading existing electric appliances. Fuel switching is not allowed.
- If electric appliances require panel or wiring upgrades, we encourage you to work with an IRA Registered Contractor to take advantage of additional HEAR rebates.

How to Participate



Income Qualification

- Apply online.
- Households must verify income at or below 150% of AML.
- Plan ahead, approval is not instant.



Make Your Purchase

You can purchase from any store or website that carries qualifying products.

Apply for a post-purchase rebate. After you make your purchase, you will fill out your [rebate request online](#) and receive a check in the mail. Some retailers offer an instant discount at the time of purchase. See our [website](#) for more information.

Installation/Rebate Submission

- Be sure appliances are installed properly and safely.
- Keep proof of purchase documentation.
 - Itemized receipts, model numbers, etc.
- Photos
 - Take photos of the **OLD** appliance before removal **AND** of the **NEW** one installed.
 - **Your rebate will NOT be approved without all required photos.**
- Submit documentation online
 - If you received an instant discount, please keep your documentation and photos. They could be requested for project verification purposes.
- Post-purchase rebate check arrives by mail in about 4 weeks.

Program Requirements

- Installation must be at your primary Wisconsin residence.
- Rebates are capped at \$14,000 per household across all HEAR projects.
