

Spot the Warning Signs

- Icicles on the edge of your roof or gutter.
- Ice coming off through the soffit.
- Ice forming behind gutters.
- · Water or ice on exterior wall.

If left untreated, ice dams can force water to back up under the shingles and into the ceiling or walls of the house, leading to warped windows, buckling floors, and collapsing drywall or plaster.
