01

02

Work with your builder and Building Performance Consultant (BPC) to determine the level of energy efficiency you can achieve.

03

Get peace of mind with third-party verification. A BPC associated with Focus on Energy completes two site visits to ensure certification standards are upheld for optimal energy efficiency.

Site Visit 1: Framing and Insulation Review

- Review framing for potential air bypasses
- Check insulation installation
- Ensure home is on track to meet program requirements

Site Visit 2: Performance Testing

- Blower door test to determine air tightness
- Ventilation capacity testing to verify ventilation performance
- Builder report verifying adherence to program requirements
