6. Submit the online application with photos and receipts.

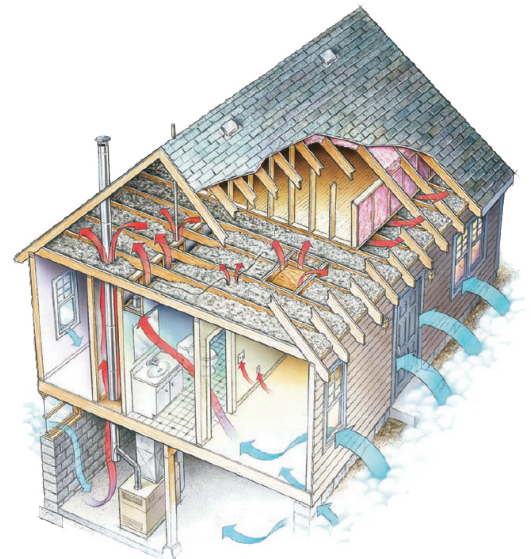

DIY: Is My Home Eligible?

SEE IF YOU QUALIFY

How do you heat your home?

Natural gas or electric

Does your utility participate in Focus on Energy?

- Moldy or rotted attic rafters or floor joists, or black areas on roof decking, indicating moisture problems.
- Kitchen, bathroom, or clothes dryer vents that exhaust directly into the attic space instead of outdoors.
- A history of ice dams in the winter.
- Little or no attic ventilation.
- Recessed can lights.
- Knee walls.
- Floored attics.
- Heating and cooling ducts in the attic.
- Complex attics or rooflines.
